



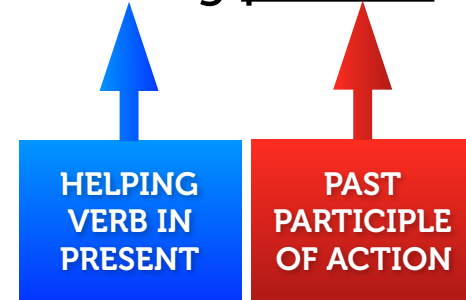

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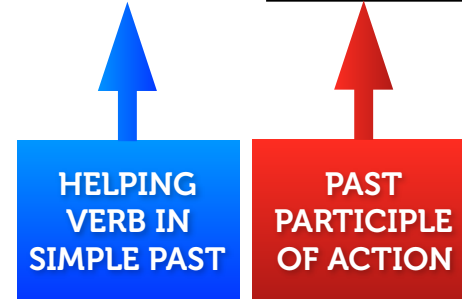
English simple past tense:

The house was built .

Active: Someone is writing a letter.

Passive: A letter is being written.

Aktiv: Jemand schreibt einen Brief.

Passiv: Ein Brief wird geschrieben.



Active: People are planting a tree.

Passive: A tree is being planted.

Aktiv: Die Leute pflanzen einen Baum.

Passiv: Ein Baum wird gepflanzt.



Active: The waiter is serving the customers.

Passive: The customers are being served.

Aktiv: Der Kellner bedient die Kunden.

Passiv: Die Kunden werden bedient.



Active: Someone is sending thank-you cards.

Passive: Thank-you cards are being sent.

Aktiv: Jemand schickt Dankkarten.

Passiv: Dankkarten werden geschickt.



Active: Someone is thanking the guests.

Passive: The guests are being thanked.

Aktiv: Jemand dankt den Gästen.

Passiv: Den Gästen wird gedankt.

Passiv: Es wird getanzt.



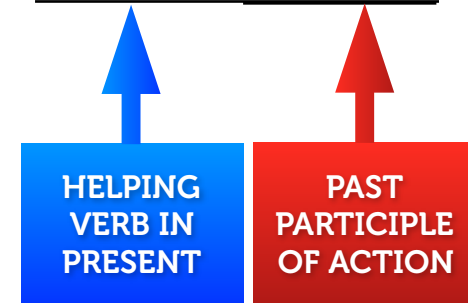

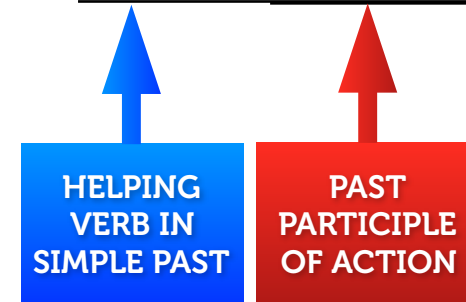

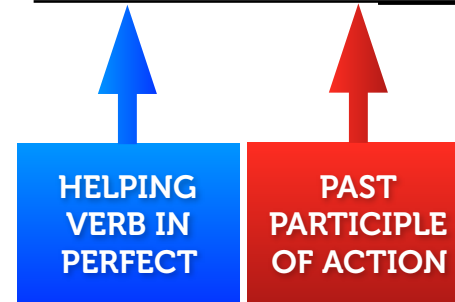
